Tree Seedling Descriptions

Species	Growth Rate	Mature Height Width	Description
Colorado Blue Spruce <i>Picea pungens</i>	Slow to Medium	30-60' H 10-20' W	Noted for its hardiness and attractive blue color. Adaptable to various sites, prefers rich, moist, well drained soils in full sun. Also thrives on drier sites.
Norway Spruce <i>Picea abies</i>	Medium to Fast	40-60' H 25-30' W	Medium growing pyramidal tree that becomes very graceful in maturity. Prefers moist, well drained acidic soils; however, it is perhaps the most adaptable common evergreen tree to harsh conditions, it thrives under seasonal drought once established, and takes well to city pollution. One requirement is to not plant in wet soils, where it will die quickly.
White Pine <i>Pinus strobus</i>	Fast	50-80' H 25-35' W	Hardy, fast growing pine native to the eastern U.S. Loosely pyramidal as a young tree, becomes more irregular with age. Prefers well drained or dry sites. Long living tree with long, soft 2-5" needles.
Arborvitae <i>Thuja occidentalis</i>	Slow to Medium	30' H 10' W	North American native tree also known as white cedar. A popular landscape tree, with a broad pyramidal shape and lush dark green summer color. Full to partial sun and prefers well-drained soil, but will tolerate other soil types.
Flame Maple <i>Acer ginnala</i>	Medium	20' H 20' W	Can be grown as a tree or multi-stemmed shrub. A very hardy tree known for its brilliant autumn color ranging from orange-red to deep red.
Northern Red Oak <i>Quercus rubra</i>	Rapid and Vigorous	60' H 70' W	Large fast-growing tree with reddish fall color. Tree is broad and rounded. Excellent for wildlife planting.
American Redbud <i>Cercis canadensis</i>	Medium	30' H 10' W	Vase shaped tree with purplish pink flowers that bloom in spring. Green foliage turns yellow in fall.
Canada Red Chokecherry <i>Prunus virginiana</i> 'Schubert'	Medium	20-30' H 15-20' W	A small tree with rich deep purple foliage from mid-summer onwards and very attractive racemes of white flowers in spring followed by small, astringent black cherries. This tree should only be grown in full sunlight. It does best in average to evenly moist conditions but will not tolerate standing water.
October Glory Maple <i>Acer rubrum</i> 'October Glory'	Medium to Fast	40-50' H 25-35' W	Outstanding, reliable, bright orange to deep, reddish purple fall color. A tall form with a dense, rounded crown and large, medium green leaves in spring and summer. Tolerant of many soils but prefers slightly acid and moist conditions. Plant in partial shade to full sun.
Princeton American Elm 'Princeton' <i>Ulmus americana</i> 'Princeton'	Fast	60' H 40' W	Resistant to Dutch elm disease. Will thrive in almost any soil condition, has a classic vase shape with yellow fall color and growth rates of 3-6 ft. per year and has been tested and approved by the USDA National Arboretum. Grows best in full sun.
