Tree Seedling Descriptions

Species	Growth Rate	Mature Height Width	Description
Colorado Blue Spruce <i>Picea pungens</i>	Slow to Medium	30-60' H 10-20' W	Noted for its hardiness and attractive blue color. Adaptable to various sites, prefers rich, moist, well drained soils in full sun. Also thrives on drier sites.
Norway Spruce <i>Picea abies</i>	Medium to Fast	40-60' H 25-30' W	Medium growing pyramidal tree that becomes very graceful in maturity. Prefers moist, well drained acidic soils; however, it is perhaps the most adaptable common evergreen tree to harsh conditions, it thrives under seasonal drought once established, and takes well to city pollution. One requirement is to not plant in wet soils, where it will die quickly.
White Pine <i>Pinus strobus</i>	Fast	50-80' H 25-35' W	Hardy, fast growing pine native to the eastern U.S. Loosely pyramidal as a young tree, becomes more irregular with age. Prefers well drained or dry sites. Long living tree with long, soft 2-5" needles.
Black Elderberry <i>Sambucus nigra</i>	Fast	8-20' H 8-20' W	Black elderberry is a large multi-stemmed deciduous shrub or small tree. Plant in moist, high organic matter, well-drained soil though it tolerates a wide range of soils including heavy clay. Full sun to partial shade, though it flowers and fruits best in the full sun. Tiny yellowish white to cream flowers on large 5" to 8" flat-topped umbel-like cymes. The attractive black fruits are edible and are used for making pies, wines, and jellies as well as being forage for birds.
Chinese Chestnut <i>Castanea mollissima</i>	Slow to Medium	40-60' H 40-60' W	This is a nut-producing tree, yielding nuts for human and wildlife consumption. Full sun is the ideal condition for this tree, meaning it should get at least six hours of direct, unfiltered sunlight each day. The Chinese chestnut grows in acidic, loamy, moist, sandy, well-drained, and clay soils. It is drought tolerant. This tree should be planted in pairs or groups to ensure pollination.
Chinkapin Oak <i>Quercus muehlenbergii</i>	Slow	70-80' H 70-80' W	Chinkapin oak is a member of the white oak family. The chinkapin oak prefers full sun and adapts to a wide range of soil conditions. It is tolerant of alkaline soils, unlike most white oaks. In its native range, this species prefers rich land with a high-water table.
Red Maple <i>Acer rubrum</i>	Medium to Fast	40-60' H 20-60' W	A rapid grower that can adapt to a wide range of soil conditions. Bright red flowers in spring followed by green leaves. Fall colors vary from yellow to scarlet. Will tolerate wet soils, prefers moist, well-drained soil.
Sweetbay Magnolia <i>Magnolia virginiana</i>	Medium to Fast	10-20' H 10-20' W	The Sweetbay magnolia has dark green leaves with a silver underside that has a frosted appearance. The 2" - 3" creamy white flowers have a light lemon scent and are visible in late spring and early summer. Full sun or partial shade are best for this tree. The Sweetbay magnolia grows in acidic, loamy, moist, rich, sandy, silty loam, well-drained and wet soils. It will tolerate periodic flooding.
